Cyberport Career Fair 2025 Commences

Al-driven Workplace Evolution with Over 2,000 I&T Job Vacancies from more than 580 organisations

Hong Kong, 21 March 2025 — Cyberport Career Fair 2025 officially commenced today, with Simon Chan, Chairman of Cyberport and Dr Rocky Cheng, CEO of Cyberport, alongside Siu Chak-yee, Commissioner of Police; Duncan Chiu, Legislative Council Member (Technology and Innovation Constituency); Donald Mak, Deputy Commissioner (Data Governance) of Digital Policy Office; Anna Au, Deputy Director of Hong Kong Talent Engage; Tori Chan, Principal Assistant Secretary for Home Affairs Bureau (Youth Affairs); and Hsu Siu-man, Executive Director, Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups (HKFYG) officiating the Kick-off Ceremony. This marked the start of the two-day event which gathered tech talent across the territory.

The Career Fair has received an overwhelming response, joined by more than 580 companies and organisations, including Cyberport community start-ups, large enterprises, technology firms, government departments, and public organisations, offering over 2,000 job vacancies. This year's event, themed "Unveiling AI Career Opportunities", focuses on exciting new career prospects brought by Artificial Intelligence (AI). For the first time, this event is co-organised with Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups (HKFYG) to jointly help young people explore career paths in the innovation and technology (I&T) field.

Cyberport Career Fair enters its 11th edition this year and continues to adopt a hybrid format, featuring both online and physical events. Participating companies include Hang Seng Bank, Centaline Property, JobsDB by SEEK, Hewlett Packard Enterprise, FUJIFILM Business Innovation Hong Kong, solution developer and system integrator Roctec, Greater Bay Area innovation and entrepreneurship platform Hex Cubes, PCCW/HKT, human resources company Manpower Group, and Dah Chong Hong Holdings. Government departments in participation include the Digital Policy Office, Hong Kong Police Force, and Labour Department participating in the Greater Bay Area Youth Employment Scheme (GBAYES). Public organisations include event co-organiser HKFYG, and St. James' Settlement. Cyberport community start-ups such as artificial intelligence of things (AloT) company Negawatt Utility, Wizpresso, VoteeAI, and BridgeAI, etc. will also be present. Among the participating employers, approximately 70% are actively recruiting AI specialists, while 60% of the job openings are related to AI application. This reflects the market's pressing demand for relevant technological talent and underscores the strategic opportunities that manifested in Hong Kong's vision of becoming an international I&T hub.

The event features over 100 physical booths, while also showcasing cutting-edge Al-driven services, in keeping with the Al theme. That include Asia' first Al-enabled interactive interview and assessment platform – Al Interviewer – developed by TechJobAsia, a Cyberport company. This innovative platform helps job seekers evaluate their interview performance through real-time dialogues and in-depth questions about industry-specific knowledge. In addition, an array of on-site activities, including CV Clinic, one-on-one professional consultation, personality test and analysis, on-site Al CV photo shooting, career counselling, etc. are also available to comprehensively enhance job seekers' employment prospects.

The two-day Career Fair will feature over 280 events, including forums, recruitment talks, and CV consultation sessions. Industry experts will be invited to discuss latest trends in the I&T sector and new career opportunities brought by AI. As a result, participants will gain a deeper understanding of emerging opportunities across various industries and will be better
